The Team must include the NOC's athlete competing in the Individual Event.

3. Quota per individual event and per team event

Individual Events

The individual events bring together sixteen (16) athletes, including one (1) Host Country place, per gender.

Team Events

The team events bring together eight (8) teams, including one (1) potential Host Country team, per gender.

4. Type of Allocation of Quota Places

The quota place is allocated to the NOC.

C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

Age

To be eligible to participate in Karate Kata at the African Beach Games, athletes must have been born on or before 22 June 2003.

Nationality

Athletes must hold the legal nationality of the country that they represent and must present a passport of that country issued by the competent authorities before the end of the registration period.

Men 7 teams (21 athletes)	The top seven (7) ranked NOCs per gender (other than the Host Country) at the 2018 African Seniors Karate Championships will obtain one team of three (3) athlete quota places for their NOC. In the event that not all 7 NOC Team Kata slots can be awarded based on the results of the 2018 African Seniors Karate Championships, the highest ranked NOCs at the 2017 African Senior Karate Championships not already qualified will obtain one team of three (3) athlete quota places for their NOC.
Women 7 teams (21 athletes)	In the event that not all 7 NOC Team Kata slots can be awarded based on the results of the 2018 or 2017 African Seniors Karate Championships, the WKF All-time Ranking will be used to identify the NOC. The total points from the top 3 athletes from each NOC in the Africa WKF All Time Ranking will be combined to create a Team Ranking and the highest ranked NOCs not already qualified, will obtain one team of three (3) athlete quota places.

HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country will automatically qualify one (1) team per gender. From each team one (1) athlete can compete in the Individual Kata event.

CONFIRMATION OF QUALIFICATION PLACES

Sal 2019 & UFAK will inform NOCs on 04 February 2019 of the number of qualification quota places obtained via the D1 and D2 qualification pathways as detailed above

The NOCs will have until 15 March 2019 to confirm if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in the Qualification Timeline.

CONFIRMATION OF HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country must confirm in writing to UFAK and Sal 2019 by 15 March 2019 if they wish to use the Host Country places.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES

If a quota place allocated is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined by the NOC the quota place will be reallocated to the next best-ranked team or athlete from an NOC not yet qualified according to D1.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

If the Host Country does not enter a team then the team event will be reduced to 7 teams.

If the Host Country does not enter any athletes then any unused Host Country Places will be reallocated according to the 'Reallocation of Unused Qualification Places' section.

If the Host Country qualifies an athlete or team in the rankings, any unused Host Country Places will be reallocated according to the 'Reallocation of Unused Qualification Places' section.
